Agenda tackled during the board meeting were the following: review of the policies and guidelines, presentation of official logo and newsletter of the consortium, proposed vision - mission statement, description/definition of the core values (TEACHERS), and presentation, finalization, and approval of programs and projects for S.Y. 2018-2019.

Chairman of the different committees presented the programs and projects while those who were given assignments/tasks to define/describe the core values presented their proposals for review, analysis, assessment, and approval of the body. It was followed by a MOA signing and socialization cum Christmas party.

On the other hand, the finalized vision of the consortium is "A reputable dynamic consortium of active TEIs of the south gathered as one in advocating excellence in teacher education through relevant programs and projects, research and extension services, and licensure and placement assistance for national and global development and sustainability".
