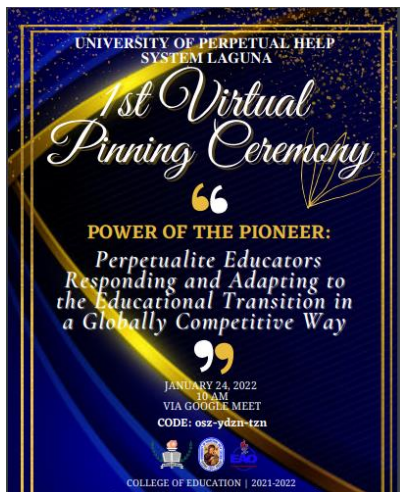


UPHSL College of Education Celebrates First Virtual Pinning Ceremony

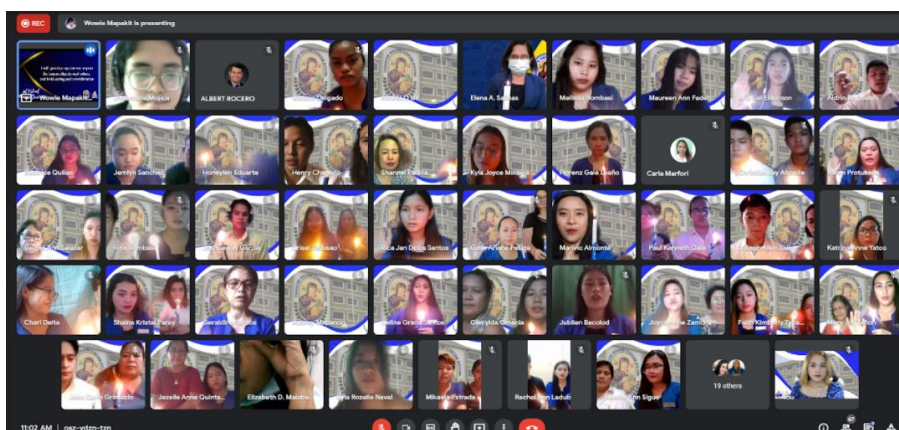
